

Women's Equality Day is celebrated in the United States on August 26 to commemorate the 1920 adoption of the Nineteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution, which prohibits the states and the federal government from denying the right to vote to citizens of the United States on the basis of sex. Remembering 9/11

In recent years, 9/11 commemorations have been placing less emphasis on the events of the day, and focusing more on the natural resilience of the US in the face of utter tragedy.

To that end, volunteering has markedly increased since the attack, as more Americans take part in community service in a positive step to remember those lost on 9/11.

The Tribute in Light reaches to 4 miles in the sky and can be seen from up to 30 miles away.

In New York, ongoing focus remains on One World Trade Center in downtown Manhattan, the tallest building in the Western hemisphere at 1,776 feet. The single skyscraper replaces the iconic Twin Towers, destroyed on September 11, 2001 marking the first ever modern attack on US soil.

Solemn ceremonies and events are planned every year to mark the day, considered one of the darkest in America's history on a par with the attack on Pearl Harbor.

Traditional 9/11 Events in NYC happening in 2021

- As always, the anniversary of 9/11 in New York City will be marked at Ground Zero with four moments of silence -- to observe the times when each plane hit and each tower fell, beginning at 8:46 am. Family members of all 9/11 victims are always invited to attend.
- Nearby St. Paul's Chapel traditionally hosts morning bell services followed by Prayers for Peace and ringing of the Bell of Hope in remembrance of 9/11.
- "The Tribute in Light" Comprised of 44 7,000-watt xenon light bulbs arranged into two 48-foot squares in the shape of the twin towers, the tribute in light is located at West and Morris Streets in Lower Manhattan. Each year, the lights are lit at sunset on 9/11 and burn brightly until sunrise on September 12

Seeing the 9/11 Memorial & Museum

The National 9/11 Memorial was dedicated on September 11, 2011 on the 10th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks in a ceremony for victims' families. The following day, it opened to the public on September 12, 2011 and remains open for visitors with advance passes.





Throughout the entire month of September. With over 40,000 kinds that grow on every continent, except in Antarctica, we have 30 days to discover as many varieties as possible. Rice is the oldest known food still consumed today. Rice was first grown about 130 million years ago in the south-eastern part of Asia. Rice is the second-highest grain produced worldwide after maize (corn). Nearly 85% of rice consumed in the U.S. is grown domestically in six states: Arkansas, California, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, and Texas. Rice is a

There are four types of rice and each is different from one another:

- White rice is the most common and the inferior rice of the four. So, unlike other rice varieties, white rice has few nutrients, making it the least healthy.
- Brown rice is whole grain rice rich in thiamine, iron, and zinc. Because of this, brown rice has a chewy texture and gives a fuller feeling after eating.
- Black rice full of rich nutty, earthy flavors. Interestingly, scientists classify black rice as a different species from white and brown rice. On a nutritional level, black rice is an excellent choice for diabetics, as it has a very low glycemic index.
- Red rice is similar to black rice on the nutrient scale, except it provides more antioxidants to the body. The antioxidants found in red rice attribute to the rich red color of the rice. (In honor of my son who eats rice 3 times a day)

Throughout September, Whole Grains Month promotes the benefits and flavors of whole grains in a healthy diet.

Whole grains include the entire seed of a plant. A grain seed is composed of three parts.

- Bran The outer shell of a seed or kernel is hard and contains important minerals, antioxidants, and fiber.
- Endosperm The next layer of a seed or kernel (or the middle layer) contains most of the carbohydrates found in grains.
- Germ The center layer provides vitamins, minerals, and necessary protein.

Whole grains are a vital part of a healthy diet. Not only do whole grains help reduce heart disease and diabetes, but it also helps improve bowel health.

A few kinds of whole grains to start incorporating in your diet include: Oat, Rice, Quinoa, Buckwheat & Bulgar
